- Born in Cheltenham, Gloucestershire, England

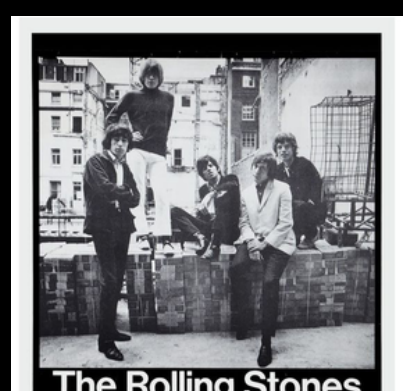

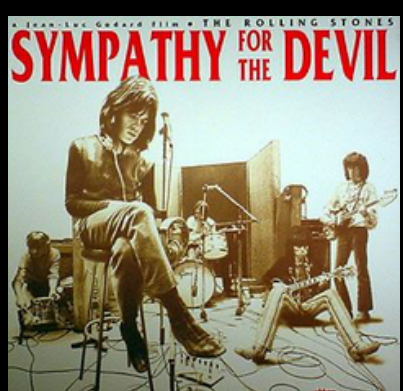

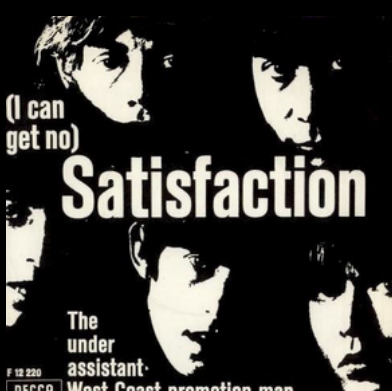
